Level 1 Water Restrictions

All Mammoth Community Water District customers are subject to Level 1 Water Restrictions as a result of less than average snow water content at Mammoth Pass.

Mammoth Lakes, California – The Mammoth Community Water District’s (District) surface water supply is reliant on the snow water content in the Mammoth Lakes Basin. April 1 marked the end of the official water year, and water content at Mammoth Pass was reported at 62% of normal. While the Mammoth Lakes Basin is fortunate to have more water than many other places in the Sierra Nevada this year, it is important to recognize this is a dry year. At the April 15 Board of Directors meeting, the District’s Board voted unanimously to declare a Level 1 Water Supply Shortage.

“Delivering surface water is always prioritized before supplementing or switching entirely to groundwater. District staff will continue to monitor water supplies closely and will advise the Board and our community as needed,” states Clay Murray, Superintendent of Operations. “Customers can do their part by reducing water consumption by 10% and following the Level 1 Water Restrictions.”

Level 1 Water Restrictions include:

- No new lawn/turf areas may be planted.
- No hard surfaces may be washed or hosed down, unless required by health or safety requirements.
- Irrigation of vegetation can only occur between 1:00 am and 7:00 am and between 5:00 pm and 11:00 pm.

Customers are reminded that, consistent with the permanent water restrictions, irrigation is limited to three days per week depending on the property’s address. Even addresses may water Monday, Wednesday, and Saturday. Odd addresses may water Tuesday, Thursday, and Sunday. Furthermore, all hoses must be equipped with an automatic shutoff device. To encourage conservation, free automatic shut off devices, showerheads, faucet aerators, and dye tablets to test toilets for leaks are available at the District offices. Also, rebates are available for toilets, dishwashers, and clothes washers.

We would like to thank our customers in advance for their compliance with regulations and efforts to reduce water demand by 10%. Past implementation of water restrictions has been met with an impressive overall water reduction from our customers, and District staff are confident this year will be no different.
